Call to Order

Special Education Update

Budget Updates - S. Miller, Superintendent, Student Achievement & Well-Being, informed members that one grant going forward for the 2017-2018 School Year is the grant supporting the LD pilot project in Cambridge Schools. A meeting will take place on May 18th in London with 8 other boards to share success stories. Still waiting to confirm the autism EPO Grant. This grant currently supports our ASD Team that provides supports and interventions for students that are experiencing difficulties at school. Our hope is that this grant will continue and that any money left over from this year will be able to be rolled over into the 2017-2018 School Year.

The per pupil allotment went up \$500 per student but the Special Education Grant as remained status quo.

Staffing Updates - Rob Klea has announced his retirement. Rob has supported numerous students with our Board. Sharon Lawton will be assuming the role of Program Leader for Behaviour Services.

All of our unions have agreed to 2 year contract extensions. Within these extensions there has been a focus on special education, which has resulted in money to be spent on staffing. At the secondary we are currently in the process of hiring an additional WATS Teacher (Work And Transitions Program). We will also be hiring an itinerant teacher (Learning for All) - to support teachers, students in Secondary Schools.

The Elementary settlement resulted in approximately 1.1 million dollars to put towards Special Education Staffing – details of this staffing are being finalized.

The Educational Assistants and Child and Youth Workers settlement resulted in \$1.4 million for staffing.

Special Education Town Hall: Reflection - Questions or comments? SEAC felt this was a good idea and allowed the group to share and problem solve. In the future this should be scheduled at regular intervals.

One discussion was changing the name of Priority 1 Class Programs (i.e., Dev Ed, etc. for the class name to not identify the class with an exceptionality).

Broke into groups to identify gaps in service, discuss recommendations and provide potential staff actions. Ideas will be collated and summarized at next meeting.

Other Business

M. Domm announced that she will no longer be representing WRDSS as of June 30, 2017 and will therefore not be the SEAC rep on the EIAG committee (Equity and Inclusion strategy). If you are interested in assuming this role, please let Karin know.
