#### Top 20 Training: Willow Sweeney

Ms. Sweeney delivered an engaging workshop about helping others to achieve their potential, through social and emotional skills development. Her examples, taken from her years as a high school teacher, resonated with participants, most of whom had experienced similar situations over their careers. Her sense of humour and enthusiasm for people provoked thoughts about the many perspectives that educators face in their work — their students, their parents, their own, their colleagues, their supervisors, their family and so on.

Ms. Sweeney encouraged all of us to strive to live our lives 'above the line' as much as possible. "Above the line" is when our thinking is serving us in our best interest. "Below the line" is when our thinking in NOT serving us in our best interest. It is important that we check where our thinking is at as often as we need to so we can develop mental habits that develop "above the line" thinking most of the time. Developing our social and emotional skills will help us to 'keep our day' in perspective and focus on the positive conditions that make our lives great.
