

Walking Distances from Alpine P.S. (2011)



Possible Draft Study Objectives

- To develop a solution that is long-term (approximately 10 years) by:
 - Creating more consistent feeds between the jr. elementary and sr. elementary program
 - Addressing future development plans and demographic shifts
 - Balancing enrolment to capacity using Board Policy 3002 -Elementary School Size and Configuration, as a guideline for school size
- To increase the number of students within walking distance to school
- To minimize the impact on students where transitions area proposed
