### What is unique about this school?

It draws students from Kitchener and Waterloo. Bridge Street is a Regional road and there is no place for parents to drop off student who are driven to school. It makes it difficult to close the parking lot to student drop off when there are no alternative to offer families. Morning drop off and afternoon dismissal is challenging and the parking lot becomes a dangerous place to be.

Bridgeport has had a number of additions since it opened in 1950 and is in the process of having a very significant construction project involving renovations to greatly enhance the existing school as well as an addition which will replace 6 portables. It is a real community school with deep roots due to its history and excellent reputation. A number of students presently attending Bridgeport had parents who also attended this school as children. It is a school with lots of heart.

### Issues of Concern:

- Floor part of terrazzo floor is breaking down (looking to replace in the summer)
- Roof have had ongoing roof leaks
- Parking ongoing challenge due to Bridge St. being a Regional road – no side street for convenient student drop off/pick up nearby
- High volume of cars in and out during arrival and dismissal times
