2.4 Summary

What is unique or noteworthy about this school?

School ground is shared by Butterfly Learning Centre

The original Lexington P.S. was closed on June 30, 1984 and students transferred to Bridgeport P.S. The school was mothballed in 1984 in case the site was needed in the future. In 1993 it reopened and a porta-pack classroom wing along with a demountable gymnasium structure was added to the original school. When it reopened, the school was intended to meet the community's needs for 15 to 20 years. It was anticipated that as the population in the area matured, there would be a reduction in the need for permanent student spaces.

Additional Comments:

A Building Condition Assessment completed by Trow Associates Inc. completed in April 2009 concluded that the school appears to be in reasonably good condition, and with appropriate maintenance would continue to be for another 5 years before major capital improvements will be required.
