Describe the conditions of the school grounds (student use): The paved sports field includes three tennis courts and an outdoor basketball court. The asphalt paving and equipment were observed to be in fair condition overall, with the exception of the 10' perimeter chain link fence. This fence is corroded, leaning in one area and the fencing deformed.

Describe the conditions of the other site facilities (parking, etc.), discuss:

The majority of the paved surfaces on the site were observed to be in very poor condition including the two parking areas, the roadway to the southwest parking area and the paved walkway across the south side of the property. There are two parking lots. Both areas were observed to be in very poor condition with alligator cracking, potholes and break-up of previous repairs. Sparse areas of the lawn were observed at the front entrance, south end of the property and other isolated locations. The roof on approximately one third of the school, specifically over the north east section of the original building and the 1991 addition, is in very poor condition. Significant water leakage is evident in these areas.

List capital improvements (if any) completed in the last 5 years: The original toilet partitions in the main washrooms of the Original building and the 1967 addition were replaced with laminate partitions in 2005
