1. Preamble

The procedures that follow describe guidelines and expectations for drama presentations on human sexuality.

2. Procedures

- 2.1 Schools shall inform parents/guardians that a Human Sexuality Unit will be taught, where applicable, as part of the Health Education Curriculum.
- 2.2 Schools shall confer with School Councils on the decision to present a Human Sexuality Drama Production for students.
- 2.3 Schools shall inform parents/guardians, with a letter from the school indicating the opportunity for students to participate in a drama presentation as part of the Human Sexuality Unit. The letter will provide an opportunity for parents/guardians to withdraw their child from participation in the presentation and indicate an alternate activity for students not participating in the presentation.
- 2.4 Schools shall provide instruction and opportunities for discussion before and following the presentation. Public Health staff shall be consulted and made available for supporting instruction regarding the presentation where appropriate.
