- 2013-14 expenses incurred to date
- Includes Board Retirement Dinner average of \$13.5K

Why is Our Enrolment Down?

- Demographics
- Changes to Ministry Policy

Demographics

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 - School Age Population in the Region is Down
 - Grade 8 to Grade 9 Attraction Rate is Down
 - Economic Growth in the Region is Down

Changes in Ministry Policies

- Factors affecting the number of Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) students generated by our student population:
 - Supervised Alternative Learning (SAL)
 - "15 Day" Rule
 - 34 Credit Threshold
- Combined, these policies reduce the amount of FTE generated by our secondary school population.

Supervised Alternative Learning

- Announced September 2010
 - Outlined new eligibility requirements for students participating in Supervised Alternative Learning (SAL) Programs
 - Reduced funding for the majority of students with a SAL Plan from 1.0 FTE to 0.5 FTE
 - Approximately 160 FTE budgeted in 14/15


"15 Day" Rule

- Announced August 30, 2012
 - Students who miss a class for 15 consecutive days without supporting medical documentation must be withdrawn from that class.
 - If a student is enrolled in 3 courses and is withdrawn from 1, reduces their enrolment status from Full-time to Part-time.


34 Credit Threshold

- Announced as part of the 2012 Ontario Budget (March 2012)
- Details provided to School Boards (January 30, 2013)
- Reduces funding for students who have successfully completed 34 credits
 - Exemptions for students within first 4 years of high school, students with an IEP, and certain credits
- 46.03 high credit FTE budgeted for 14/15
