REPORTS

2019-2020 BUDGET RECOMMENDATIONS

Coordinating Superintendent M. Gerard began by responding to questions raised during and after the 2019-2020 Budget Recommendations report at the June 17, 2019, Committee of the Whole meeting. Information was provided on local taxation, secondary enrolment growth and capacity, class sections for secondary schools and average secondary class sizes.

JUNE 19, 2019 SPECIAL COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE BUDGET MEETING

Trustees asked questions regarding capacity, the reduction in class sections and the process for determining class sections.

Coordinating Superintendent M. Gerard provided further details on the increase to the Behaviour Expertise Amount, the Mental Health Workers in Secondary School Priority and Partnership Funds (PPF) and Special Education funding.

Trustees asked questions of clarification regarding Special Education service levels to students and resource allocation.

Coordinating Superintendent M. Gerard provided further details on the Community Use of Schools (CUS) Priority School funding previously received and confirmed there would be no fee increase in 2019-2020. Fees for 2020-2021 are currently under review and any changes will be announced.

Trustees asked if during the CUS fee review, staff could give consideration to groups who provide important services to our students and families. Director J. Bryant agreed and offered to provide follow up information in the fall.

Coordinating Superintendent M. Gerard provided further details on the Contracts for Services line items in the Expense Functions portion of the budget report and the process for identifying projects for the Pupil Accommodation Grant funding.

Trustees asked further questions of clarification regarding the Priority and Partnership Funds and commended staff on the balanced budget.
