REPORTS

COVID-19 UPDATE - RETURN TO SCHOOL AND WORK

Director J. Bryant started the presentation with a review of the work staff have done over the last two months and the key partners involved in the process. He provided a brief update on the presentation made today to the Ministry of Education regarding the WRDSB's Return to School

and Work plan. He reiterated that Human Rights and Equity continue to be at the forefront of the decision making.

Associate Director L. Read reviewed the Guiding Principles and parameters in developing the return to school models. Dr. D. Liebermann, Senior Manager of Research and Evidence-Based Practice, provided information on the Intention to Return to School and Work In Person Form for Students & Staff.

Associate Director L. Read reviewed the three scenarios and the breakdown of four cohorts of students, providing additional information regarding Cohorts C and D. Superintendent S. Miller reviewed the plans for students with special needs and the most vulnerable students. Superintendent E. Ranney reviewed the plans to address student well-being plans.

Superintendents E. Giannopoulos and R. DeBoer provided further detail on the Full Return Model with enhanced Health and Safety Protocols and the Adaptive / Hybrid Model for both elementary and secondary students. Superintendent E. Ranney reviewed the full Distance Learning Model.

Coordinating Superintendent M. Weinert reviewed staff health, safety and well-being as it relates to the return to school and work plan. Superintendent B. Lemon reviewed student health and safety.

Chief Communications Officer A. Russell reviewed signage and the communication plan for return to school and work.

Trustees asked questions related to masks and the health and safety of students.
