1. Preamble

1.1 The procedures provide guidelines and expectations regarding the administration of fire drills.

2. General

- 2.1 In schools, total evacuation fire drills shall be held three times in each of the fall and spring school terms. (Reg. 388/97 Fire Code, under the Fire Protection and Prevention Act, 1997)
- 2.2 Every Principal, including the Principal of a Continuing Education Program, or of a class or classes conducted outside of the school year, shall hold at least one emergency drill in the period during which the instruction is given.
- 2.3 When a fire or emergency drill is held in a school building, every person in the building shall take part in the fire or emergency drill.
- 2.4 Tornado drills are in addition to the six fire drills. (Administrative Procedure 3070 Tornado Conditions)
- 2.5 The purpose of a fire drill is to ensure that the occupants and staff are totally familiar with emergency evacuation procedures, resulting in orderly evacuation with efficient use of exit facilities.
- 2.6 Kitchener Fire Department is to be notified prior to and upon completion of the fire drill by telephoning (519) 741-2494.
- 2.7 Following each drill, all persons of delegated responsibility should attend a debriefing to report on their actions and the reactions of the occupants. Fire drills must be conducted in accordance with the frequencies stated in the fire code.
- 2.8 At non-school sites, total evacuation fire drill will occur in the fall of each year.
