Universal Design for Learning to Accommodations on the Individual Education Plan (IEP)

- Universal Design for Learning: High quality instruction accessible to all students
- Dealing with Differences between kids: Knowing individual strengths & needs of students;
  learning tasks tailored to small groups or individuals
- Accommodations on an IEP: How content is presented & the way they know how.

IEP: written action plan describing the special ed program &/or services required by a particular student based on a thorough assessment of the strengths & needs that affect the student's ability to learn & demonstrate learning

IEP: working document

IEP is not: description of everything that will be taught to the student, list of all teaching strategies, a daily lesson plan.

Consultation with families include connecting with them via:

- Interviews
- phone conferences
- Google meets
- Google forms
- use of Talking Points app

IEP Plan Team: student, parent/guardian, teacher, spec ed resource teacher, paraprofessionals, principal/vice principal, professional student support services (speech language pathologist)

Sources to Support the Development of an Individual Education Plan:

- Ontario Student Record (OSR)
- Report Cards
- Academic Assessment
- Educational Assessments
- Psychological Assessments
  - Some limited ability through the school board (WRDSB)
- Privately paid
- Speech Language Assessment
- Medical Documentation

Questions asked by school staff for you as a parent/guardian about the IEP plan for your child.

- What is the most important thing we should know about your child?
- What are your child's strengths?
- What is the best way to motivate your child?
- My child learns best when the teacher is...
- Describe your child's passions, talents, interests
- What does your child like the most about school? Is there anything you would like to see changed?
- What are your hopes for your child this year?

#### Accommodations:

- Teaching strategies
- Supports
- Services that provide students with access to the curriculum
- Environmental assessment strategies
- Medical

Modifications: changes made to grade level curriculum expectations for a subject or course to meet the needs of the student

 A way to keep student with their peers instead of falling behind the grade level of their peers age wise

Alternative expectations: skill development in areas not represented in Ontario curriculum

IEP plan across the year

• All plans are reviewed within 30 days

#s of school based IEP plans: no point in discussing

How does a student qualify for educational assistant support?

Process for accessing an IEP plan: start with classroom teacher, then can move to special resource teacher

Education Assistants: WRDSB has a close relationship with Conestoga College and students work with the school board

Gifted Education: What is the process for identification in the WRDSB: assessment, evaluation at the school level; parent can bring it up with the classroom teacher what they see & can ask teacher what they see

Information shared by a parent with the school is confidential. Info is often helpful to teachers

If your child's IEP expectations are not being followed like resources & accommodations being listed: go back to the classroom teacher to enquire.
