- 1. Jenn Checkley, Easter Seals <u>Camp E-aster Seals 2020</u> Winter virtual camp running from December 18-23, registration deadline is December 16.
- 2. Angela Geddes, FASD/ONE Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder
 - The FASD Family / Caregiver Support Group Project. It is important to note that the prevalence rate for FASD is low estimated at 4-5% which is higher than ASD (1.52%), CP (2.1%), Down's Syndrome (0.14%) and Tourette's syndrome (0.10%) combined. We also know that most people do not realize that they or their children may be struggling due to prenatal exposure to alcohol. As a result, the support that is offered through government FASD initiatives are meant to include people who may not have a diagnosis but may be experiencing challenges related to concentration, impulse control, sleep, memory and academic achievement for examples that could be related to PAE. Your parent group efforts could qualify for these subsidies if you are interested as long as they would be inclusive and adequately supportive of

caregivers experiencing the complexities of raising a child with learning and mental health challenges and or complex neurodevelopmental disability which would include, ADHD, FASD.
