Both public and catholic board. Related to graduation rates. School success is connected to socioeconomic factors. Kids who are far behind in gr 3 move to average by high school. Concerns with French Immersion More students taking a 5th year vs other areas of the province. Graphs to show graduation and achievement rates vs the provincial average. Graph of factory jobs in the Region. Jeff feels that families took a hit and affect achievement. Graph to show that education rates of adults and young adults are increasing. Questions about school board accountability. Concerns about changes to french immersion and what that will impact for other programs. What can we do as parents. It is a really difficult program to manage. No suggestion. Question: many parents gave feedback about why 5th year is important. Concern that all of Jeff's data is based on EQAO which is known to be faulty. Not a good indictor of success. Yes there are problems with EQAO but it's the only data he can get. Question: alot of the data is factors beyond the school boards control. What can we do about this? Are there other school boards with similar socioeconomic data that is doing better? Has not looked at other boards. Has only looked at individual schools that have made big achievements. 7:35- 7:50	 Student scholarship program that they are hoping to launch this year. Want to intersect strong mind and body. Fully funding 4 kids for the first year. Targeting certain age groups 8-12 13-16. Would get in person oxford learning 2 times a week and 1 time a week in gym. Integrated program. After one pilot year may be able to help more kids. Alot of the information will be launched on social before the program goes live. Wanting to get the program on school council's radars and more information will come. Two Common ways to approve teacher requests is to have teachers submit a list. You are allowed to save up for outdoor equipment over multiple years. Sometimes for outdoor projects/ gardens - sometimes neighbourhood associations/ community centres will help. Things like chrome books are not allowed to be funded because it is a warranty issue, but there are concerns about why things like gym equipment allowed? Shouldn't school board pay for that?
