Special Education Update – Scott Miller

- WRDSB Special Education Plan Cindy Benedetti:
 - Has been in contact with Communications Department and in September we will look at updating our plan.
 - We have a co-op student from W. Ross School for the Blind who has been reviewing our plan. She has indicated that our plan is good around the accessibility piece. We want to make the plan and the document more accessible to parents.
 - Has reviewed other school board's plans to get ideas.
 - Asking for SEAC Members to review section 17 which is the SEAC portion.
 - Requesting for interested SEAC Members to be part of a committee to work on revising the plan and to work throughout the 2019-2020 year starting in September.

Budget

- Grants for Student Needs (GSN) have been approved and projected to be on average \$12,246 per pupil. A portion of the per pupil amount goes to the special education budget.
- EPO Grants now called Priorities and Partnerships Fund (PPF)

- 3 year Learning Disabilities Pilot Project Grant was to end this year but will be extended for another year.
- October Report (OnSIS)
 - Review of elementary and secondary reports. L. Gil to send copies.
 - Elementary schools have a total of 6,831 students with an IEP. There are a total of 8,327 Elementary Students that are accessing some kind of Special Education support.
 - Secondary schools have a total of 4,592 students with an IEP. There are
 5,079 Secondary Students that are accessing some kind of Special
 Education support.
- Transition Planning and Class Placements
 - Currently finalizing placements and families are being given this information throughout the month of May.
