#### What to Look For on the Provincial Report Card

The first and most important place to look is the Learning Skills and Work Habits section. Well-developed Learning Skills and Work Habits can have a positive impact on your child's academic achievement.

As you read each teacher's comments, note how these describe how your child's learning in each course, your child's strengths, and your child's next steps. Also, make a note of any key evidence of learning mentioned in this area that your child still needs to provide to the teacher.

#### **What the Percentage Grades Reflect**

Percentage grades reflect each student's most consistent level of achievement, and are determined on the basis of both mathematical calculations and teachers' professional judgement in interpreting the evidence of learning. The table below summarizes the levels of achievement:

## **PARENT/GUARDIAN GUIDE**

In May 2010, the Ministry of Education published a policy document titled *Growing Success – Assessment*, Evaluation and Reporting in Ontario Schools. Beginning in September 2010, assessment, evaluation and reporting in Ontario schools are based on the policies and practices described in this document.

All students in Grades 9-12 in Ontario receive:

- a first Provincial Report Card and
- a final Provincial Report Card at the end of the semester.

Students whose program includes alternative expectations will receive an Alternative Program Report Card attached to the Provincial Report Card. Alternative Program Report Cards are sent home three times in the year.

#### The Provincial Report Card

Before the final Provincial Report Card at the end of the semester, students will receive a first Provincial Report Card.

The first Provincial Report Card provides an opportunity to reflect upon progress part way through the semester, and to discuss plans for future success. The first Provincial Report Card is designed to show:

- your child's development of six learning skills and work habits part way through the semester;
- your child's achievement of the overall curriculum expectations part way through the semester.

The percentage grades that appear on the first Provincial Report Card for each course are based on the learning that has occurred to date, and do not reflect the complete course content. As a result, these grades may change significantly on the final Provincial Report Card, depending on your child's ongoing demonstration of learning in each course.
