- Budget update: We do not have Core funding allocated at this time. We are in the planning stages for next year. Hoping to maintain our current staffing levels.
- Elizabeth Ziegler PS had some challenges with their building. The school was closed on March 4, 2025. The transition started with virtual classrooms until we could move students to other sites. 3 ACE classes are now located at JW Gerth PS, and 1 enrichment class is now located at Brigadoon PS. Students will be staying at their new location for the next school year. We are making necessary adjustments to current classroom spaces.

- Trustee Governance Model Bill 198 was discussed, involving changes to the governing structure during Board Meetings.
- Elizabeth Ziegler PS updates: Staff were involved in the reorganization.
 Managed to put a plan in place in a short time frame.
- Math Achievement Action Plan presentation to Trustees. The math team updated that the Ministry was at our school Board recently. Looked at the emotional and instructional side of math. The math team is developing PD sessions for functional numeracy skills for kindergarten and ACE students for math facilitators, congregated teachers and itinerant Spec. Ed teachers. Budget numbers will be coming soon for next year. The math team has indicated there are not enough staff for all of the professional development requests received this year and are hoping for the money to continue on the same scale or allow for an increase from this current year.
