WRDSB Special Education & Student Well-Being Report - Jodi Albrecht

- System Updates
 - J. Albrecht provided an update that the WRDSB has recently appointed Scott Miller as the Interim Director of Education.
 - Last meeting information was shared about a transition meeting from the <u>Regional Assessment Resource Centre</u> (RARC) through Queen's University. The centre assists students with disabilities across the province that are transitioning to post secondary studies. The event happened November 26, 2024, and for your reference there is a recording available of the <u>Transition Info Night</u> that took place.
 - Lunch and Learn sessions through the WRDSB have continued.
 December's session was: <u>Handling after-school meltdowns</u>. Next month's sessions are as follows: January 8; Understanding a Psychological Assessment, January 22; Fostering and Nurturing a Growth Mindset, January 29; Teen Mental Health. Future sessions will be posted on the Board website as News items, or on the X feed. Past

- sessions are posted on the WRDSB website under Special Education/Psychological Services and on YouTube.
- The Assistive Tech team did a <u>presentation</u> last spring to SEAC on the SEA Assistive Technology Team and how the WRDSB can come together across departments to support our schools and students. Currently they have been working in partnership with the French department to incorporate assistive technology for students with special education needs. Please find the upcoming RelATe parent technology sessions information for: <u>January</u>, and <u>February</u>.
- Jancie Heise-Clarkson (SEA Special Education Consultant) and Stephanie Ringwood (French Consultant) presented at the Modern Language Council on supporting multilingual learners and students with special needs in French programs. The focus is on ensuring students in both Core French and French Immersion who have special education needs have access to the necessary accommodations to support their learning and achievement alongside their peers. It specifically focused on showcasing the positive impact of technology with students with learning disabilities. We offer our thanks in recognition of the team's good work in the service of our students at the WRDSB.
- Last month the Math Consultants <u>presented</u> to SEAC, and they are currently partnering with our ACE team to work on new PD sessions.
 They are partnering to develop math kits and resources to support ACE classroom educators.
 - Feedback: Interested in seeing the math kits available
- Emily Gray (Mental Health Lead) <u>presented</u> to SEAC about mental health last spring on including a collaborative approach across the system and enhancing inclusive community partnerships. The team will continue to work with our consultants to provide direction and support through various strategies and services to our schools.

- There are more professional learning opportunities for staff at the WRDSB such as: UDL, IEP development, and sessions focusing on mental health.
- For the upcoming March PD day teachers and EA support staff will deepen their knowledge of ACE student learning profiles and the ACE program framework with the scope on alternative programming. They will also have a session on the Universal Supports Planning guide, the roles and responsibilities, identifying the guiding principles of their ACE classrooms, and how to work effectively as a team.
