WRDSB Special Education & Student Well-Being Report - Jodi Albrecht

- Transportation Update
 - We started the year with significant transportation concerns with the
 cyber attack in the summer and ongoing driver shortages. Things have
 been cleaned up and there has been lots of improvement. Student
 Transportation Services is providing a monthly report to update on any
 issues with any special education transportation.
- Labour Update there is no update at this time
- S4S Update
 - The Support 4 Students (S4S) database is used by staff to enter student information with special education needs and multilingual learner (MLL) students. We have had challenges due to the new student information system Aspen and the cyber attack.

- The paper copy of students' IEP and alternate reports were delayed going home. We now have full access to the system but it is only accessible at the WRDSB schools or board sites because of the new firewall.
- We continue to work with Learnstyle who supports the database and hope we can move forward to update any errors. Our staff, IT
 Department, Special Education Consultants and Learnstyle continue to work hard to get everything updated and entered into the student database.

Off-Campus Field Trips

- Reviewed <u>Feedback: Off Campus Excursion Category I and II Trips</u> from previous meeting
- Concern that there is not enough EA support for students to go on field trips. Oftentimes parents will need to attend trips with their child if an EA is not available to attend the trip or they will be unable to attend.
- Part of the planning process upfront is to make sure we include all students to allow them equal opportunities to attend a trip.
- Student voice is important in order to advocate what kinds of trips they
 would like to participate in that would be inclusive for all students.
- Connecting with families prior to messaging going out to make sure all student's needs are being met with a trip should be included in the planning stages.
- Family engagement What are things you appreciate? What would you like to see?
 - We are working with our new administrators on the student support process and will continue this work in the new year
 - Learning how we can be engaged by your schools
 - Families have enjoyed having access to google suite and feel more connected with their child's education with this communication tool
 - Would like to see more information and support for families on transition to high school so families know the process. Varied experiences from schools to schools. Topic for future meeting.

- Important for teachers to think outside the box to include students with special needs
- What are some goals we would like to set as a SEAC group?
 - Summer tutoring programming or camp opportunities for students with special education needs
 - Updating the website, handbook, outreach program to share some of our missions with each of our community groups

 - More accessible information to help parents understand the process of special education
 - Community crossovers in order to get insights from each other, share ideas and learn from each other
