Business Arising from the Minutes

Equity & Inclusion Advisory Group Updates - Carmen Sutherland

- Has been a member of EIAG for 1.5 years and on a learning journey with everyone
- Current discussion items for this past year include the following:
 - Review of Ontario Federation of Student Athletic Association (OFSAA)
 Gender Equity Policy. Advocating for transgener, male/female sports,
 religious dress, and accessibility for disabilities under this policy.
 - Advising on the revisions to the Student Dress Code Policy
 - Input on Board Policy 4020 Naming and Renaming of Board Facilities
 - Student Trustee Elections and Student Senate trying to be more equitable and changing to Student Roundtable format instead
 - Received funding for a Graduation Coach Program for Black Students
 - Inclusive and representative books and resources in school library review are taking place. EIAG members see the actions of the board as

necessary steps towards creating a learning environment in which everyone, regardless of who they are, sees themselves reflected in learning materials.

- Focusing on decentering specific traditional holiday celebrations
- Provide feedback on the Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act (AODA)
- Continued work with Indigenous groups, Ontario Human Rights
 Commission, anti-racism and anti-oppression

WRDSB Special Education & Student Well-Being Report – Scott Miller

- Budget Update (2022/2023)
 - All contracts end on August 31, 2022. Next school year will be a bargaining year and often contract negotiations go well into the new school year.
 - Contracts provided additional funding funding was used for mental health and special education support/staff
 - The government provides yearly funding through the General Student Needs (GNS) and Priorities and Partnership Funding (PPF)
- Revised PPM 81 (Draft)
 - The government will be revising Policy/Program Memorandum 81:
 Provision of health support services in school setting (PPM 81)
 - Some of the key objectives of the review are:
 - Strengthening evidence-based practices
 - Improving access to health, rehabilitation and other community-based clinical services for students with special needs in schools
 - Clarifying role and responsibilities to address gaps in service
 - Ongoing consultation to various groups and organizations. Directors of Education and Superintendents have met as well to provide feedback.
 - Work that was previously done by nurses and PSWs will now potentially default to School Board staff

- Who will provide the training for injection, medication dispensing,
 catheterization and suctioning that will now require staff to potentially do this?
- With the current procedure of students having a plan of care in schools it has provided better support for students
- The PPM is not finished yet and is in the preliminary stages with possible implementation to start September 2022
- All staff have a duty of care to support students in any medical situation
- WRDSB Speech-Language Pathology Services Presentation Melanie
 Gravel, Speech-Language Pathologist Lead
 - We provide family support with foundational skills
 - There is an equity issue for marginalized families and an increase in case loads with students not having access to support outside of the board
 - The Right to Read Report will be coming out where we can further strengthen our work with the speech and language team to help implement this work and support
- Practices to Build On
 - Short term virtual learning program ends on Friday, February 11, 2022
 - Most students have returned to in person learning
 - Students are also opting out of remote learning and returning to school
