- Information
 - Labour Update
 - All groups are continuing to engage in local negotiations. There
 has been no disruption for students during the negotiation
 process.
 - EQAO
 - 2022-2023 EQAO Report to Board Presentation
 - All students write the EQAO testing including students with an IEP. Some students may be exempt from participating in the testing. Teachers and administrators review these requests on a case by case basis.
 - Continued work and evaluation is being done as to how best to support students through the EQAO process
 - Students can participate in other assessments to see where they are at such as PISA. PISA is the OECD's Programme for International Student Assessment. PISA measures
 15-year-olds' ability to use their reading, mathematics and science knowledge and skills to meet real-life challenges. Visit the website for more information: <u>https://www.oecd.org/pisa/</u>
- Discussion/Feedback
 - SEAC letter for Parent IEP guide
 - During our December meeting we discussed an IEP Family
 Guide which would be in the form of a pamphlet that would go home with all students at the beginning of the school year along with the SEAC information pamphlet. This would also be posted on the website.
 - We are continuing to gather information from other groups and once we have an updated document, we will bring this information back to SEAC for further review and feedback

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Chair Report - Shannon Taylor

- Bringing website information back to February
 - R. Thompson, S. Taylor, S. Penny and J. Checkley will continue to work on the SEAC information documents and will bring this back to our February meeting for further review
 - Discussion regarding a powerpoint slide presentation that could be sent to administrators to share with the school parent council
 - Acknowledged that we want to make the information on the documents to be in simple terms as what they can expect from SEAC and how SEAC can support families/caregivers
 - These documents can also help support teachers to have information they can provide to families
 - Once all complete, the Communications Department will assist with updating the documents on the website

 - Reviewed the letter and members agreed to send a letter in support of the letter sent by the Hastings and Prince Edward DSB to the Ministry
 - S. Taylor will follow-up with J. Albrecht to prepare the letter for review by SEAC

 J. Meissner - during our December meeting, we discussed that there are a number of Minister's Advisory Council Special Education (MACSE) vacancies. On the website it indicates that there are 5 vacancies. At the next board meeting J. Meissner & S. Estoesta will discuss the Board supporting a letter to be sent inquiring why the vacancies haven't been filled, what they are doing to get these positions filled and if the information is up to date on the website. S. Estoesta - Currently working with the Policy Review Committee using Lexicon on the best way to list a person's identity as well as consistent use of the term of families/caregivers when updating policies. Will provide an update once they have further information.
