WRDSB Special Education & Student Well-Being Report – Scott Miller

- Return to School Update
 - Students with special education needs in the ACE classrooms had the opportunity to attend school in person during the week of January 10-14
 - Staff worked collaboratively to get things organized for ACE students to return to school
 - N95 masks were provided to the ACE program staff

- All students will be able to return to in person learning on January 17th
- Feedback from families is mixed some are happy the students are returning and others have concerns
- We continue to focus on helping support student's well being through a trauma informed approach
- Funding was released for the second half of the school year and additional staff has been added (social workers, psychologist and speech-language pathologists)
- Contact tracing expectations for COVID 19 has changed and we are still formalizing the new expectations for staff and students
- Staffing is a concern to make sure that we have staff to support students
- School and classroom closures are a possibility depending on circumstances
- Communications Department will continue to provide any updates through website and emails for families
- Positive feedback received that the Board has had good practices as to how we have communicated to schools
