Staffing Update

- The WRDSB is in a deficit and therefore having to look at changes in spending in order to balance the budget for next year.
- The WRDSB is waiting for the funding allocation for next year
 where we receive Grants for Student Needs (GSN) and
 temporary funding through grants to finalize staffing decisions.
 Last year we received the funding late which resulted in some
 staff having to return to schools late in the school year.

 eclipse will begin at 2:03 p.m. for the Waterloo Region and will
 end at 4:30 p.m. The WRDSB has decided to keep the schools
