Mental Health Presentation - Gwenyth Le-Phuong, Mental Health Lead

- SEAC Mental Health Presentation
 - Since the pandemic there is a difference in students' well-being, social and emotional skills. Students missed school opportunities and need to grieve these losses.
 - There is a need to reteach behaviors, structure and support mental health
 - It's important to have transition plans for students when staff changes occur. Oftentimes students struggle with changes to their routine which affects the students.
 - Students with special education needs often feel isolated and left out of activities in and out of the school environment. We need to create intentional opportunities for kids to be social and included.
 - Supporting all students and allowing them to do things on their own in order for them to be able to deal with good and bad stressful situations.
