WRDSB Special Education & Student Well-Being Report - Jodi Albrecht

- Ministry of Education Updates
 - Bill 98 is a new requirement for schools to post a detailed summary of PD day activities at the school and board websites. The School Year Calendar Committee submits all of the plans to the Ministry two weeks in advance of the PD Day.
 - Policy/Program Memorandum 169 (PPM 169) focuses on student mental health. It comes into effect January 1, 2024. We will be bringing a team together to do this work. We are in the process of hiring a new Mental Health Lead who will support this work. This will involve a three-year mental health and addictions strategy and a one-year action plan.
 - The staff on the Mental Health & Strategy Committee will share their plans to SEAC at a future meeting and request feedback

- Labour Updates
 - Meetings are being held at the central table with the Province, not locally. We have 9 collective agreements that have expired and negotiations are in the process. They are still in the early stages and we will continue to provide monthly updates.
- School Start-Up
 - Everyone centrally at the board started the first day of school assisting at a school. It was nice to see the energy and excitement with students and staff.
 - There were a number of transportation issues related to the database but consultants and STSWR have been working hard to get kids transported to school
 - Acknowledgement to all staff for the hard work that is involved in getting a school up and running for the first day of school
 - Staff are working on IEPs that will be sent home in mid-October.
 Collaboration with staff and families engaging to honour student and family voices when preparing the IEP.
 - We will continue to have our SEAC meetings virtually as this allows more flexibility for members and we can always reassess throughout the year
 - Last year we applied for a grant from the Ministry to fund a conference for Removing Barriers for Children with Disabilities. The board was approved for the grant and there is a team of people that will be dedicated to this work. They are in the initial planning stages and we will invite this group to come and present at a meeting to share what they are working on. The conference will take place at the end of May.
