 - Questions about speakers: Looking for a balance that finds more time to address member questions, in addition to guest speakers.


- Note: members are encouraged to send questions/concerns to wrapsc@gamil.com before meetings so that we can find information to help answer questions prior to meetings.
- If caregivers/councils have questions/concerns regarding WRDSB policies, these should be directed towards <u>WRDSB Trustees</u> or PIC (Note: we do not have a direct contact for PIC at this time. This will be a question brought forward at the next meeting)
- Question for members: What do we want to see from <u>PIC</u>?
 - Members need additional clarification on the role PIC plays.
 - Chromebook/Television Usage: clear policy detailing usage in the classroom.
 - Accountability for PIC: how do we have more consistency? Who is accountable for what? Who do we go to with our concerns? Greater transparency needed.
- PRO Grant approvals have been shared! Check in with the school/Principal
- Members share that they didn't hear about PRO Grant— how can we better communicate? How can communication be more consistent?
- Think about: How are your meetings going to happen? Example: will you vote on virtual vs in-person for next year? Ensure that you are voting on all major decisions at your school council meetings. This makes transitions between administrators easier.
- Council should be filling out 2 forms: "Principal Profile Form" and
 "Survey— End of year report". These forms come from your principal.
- Did you know there is a <u>School Council Handbook</u>?
 - Suggestion: Recap your council by-laws at your initial meeting (see Handbook linked above)
