#### **Future Grade 9 Survey**

# Why is the WRDSB interested in Grade 8 students' transition to high school?

The transition from elementary school to high school is an important change in students' lives. This change presents students with opportunities to grow and can also be a time of uncertainty or vulnerability for some students. Because this represents such an important time for students, the WRDSB wants to make sure that students have the resources, opportunities, and support they need to successfully transition to this next step in their learning.

# What are students being asked to do?

You are invited to complete an online survey during class time that will take 10 to 15 minutes to complete.

# What kinds of questions are on the survey?

On this survey we are asking you to tell us about the different things you've experienced in Grade 8 to get ready to go to high school in the fall. Some examples include questions about: attending Grade 8 information nights, learning about the requirements to earn a high school diploma, opportunities to explore different areas of study, occupations, and careers, how prepared you feel for high school, and the things you are looking forward to or are concerned about.

## What else do students need to know about this survey?

The survey is voluntary. This means that you do not have to participate if you do not want to and it will not affect your relationship with your teachers, your school or the school board. This also means that you don't have to answer any question you do not want to answer. You can skip any question on the survey by leaving it blank.

The survey is anonymous. This means that no one will know which answers are yours except you. You will not be asked to provide your name or other personal information that could identify you such as your email address or student ID.

If you change your mind about taking part in the survey after you've started, you can stop participating by closing the survey and not submitting your answers.

#### How will the information that students provide be protected?

Once you submit your survey, your responses will be combined with the responses of all the other Grade 8 students who take part in the survey. The results of the survey will be reported for the group of Grade 8 students who take part. Both of these things will help protect individual student responses from being identified.

Only a small number of WRDSB staff members will have access to students' survey responses. These staff members are responsible for analyzing the survey results and they will keep the survey responses in password-protected files on a secure department computer for 7 years.

### How will the information that students provide be used?

The WRDSB will use the results of this survey to help improve the ways we support Grade 8 students as they transition to Grade 9. We will share summaries of the results with participating schools, board staff, trustees, and the Ministry of Education.
